

Entertainment Review: "Killer Whales"

TJCAA Structural Designer Hernando Montoya recently viewed a fascinating documentary about orcas, titled "Killer Whales," which explores the fierce Orcinis orca in the wild. Both highly social and highly deadly, the film demonstrates, these whales are the ocean's greatest predators, and are sometimes referred to as the "human's counterpart in the sea."

The documentary exposes how these mammals communicate and teach their young calves where to feed, breed, and hunt. Hunting is a key topic, with dramatic footage demonstrating the orca's incredible skills. These whales hunt in both shallow and deep waters, attacking not only harmless prey such as penguins, but also ferocious species such as great white sharks. (TV-PG.
